BEFORE YOU LEAVE

Here are some important things you need to know to make your arrival as smooth as possible. Use our checklist to ensure you don't forget anything and are prepared for the exciting times ahead.



POCKET MONEY

Separate to your travel expenses, we recommend a weekly budget of £80–100. This should cover personal expenses, laundry and Kaplan activities. You will need additional money if you want to take weekend trips. Bring £100 with you in cash and a debit or credit card. Do not bring foreign currency. It is not wise to carry around large amounts of cash.

BANK ACCOUNT

If you're staying longer than six months, you may wish to open a bank account. If possible, set up your account before you arrive as rules, regulations and policies between banks vary. You may be required to bring personal documentation with you; remember it may take a long time to set up the account, so make sure you still have access to money during this process.

CLOTHING

Most students dress casual for classes, but you should bring nice clothes for going out and active clothes for sports and outdoor activities. The climate is changeable and may be different from your own. The typical temperature is 20°C in the summer and 0°–10°C in the winter, although it can drop below freezing. Bring waterproof clothing if you're arriving in the winter and an umbrella as it often rains in the UK.

ELECTRICAL CURRENT

Standard voltage in the UK is 240 volts; remember to bring an adaptor with you or buy one when you arrive.

MOBILE PHONE

Ensure your phone is unlocked before you purchase a local SIM card, otherwise you will need to purchase a temporary mobile phone when you arrive. Please be advised it is easier to unlock your phone before you depart your country.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE

ACCOMMODATION

STUDENT RESIDENCE

THINGS STUDENTS NEED TO BRING:

Toiletries, prescription medication and towels

SERVICES INCLUDED:

Basic appliances and furniture, cooker, microwave, fridge, freezer, crockery, utensils and bed linen

EXTRA COST OF SERVICES:

Average cost per load of laundry is £5

MEALS PROVIDED:

Meals are self-catering; all apartments have a fully-equipped kitchen

LAUNDRY FACILITIES:

There are laundry facilities in the complex; an iron and ironing board are available

SECURITY:

You are responsible for keeping your own room secure. Kaplan International Languages cannot be responsible for items that go missing in the residence

PRIVATE ACCOMMODATION

Only students aged 18 and over are permitted to go into private accommodation. If you are 16 or 17 years old you will be housed in a homestay and should be home by 11 pm each night.

If you are over 18 here are some tips if you want to find your own apartment or share a house with friends:

- The school's Accommodation Officer can provide a list of local letting agencies
- Check whether the accommodation you are going to see is in a safe area
- Take a friend with you when you go to view any accommodation
- If you are sharing an apartment or house find out who has access to it
- Make sure the accommodation has a recent safety certificate – all cookers are electric fires are safe and smoke alarms are fitted
- Make sure your room is secure and that you have insurance for your laptop, camera, TV, DVD, personal music player and other valuable items
- If you rent your own accommodation you will be expected to pay Council Tax. Be aware that it could be up to £1,200 per year. Letting agencies will ask for a UK guarantor or 6 months rental payment upfront.

HOMESTAY

ABOUT HOMESTAY MEALS

BREAKFAST:

Breakfast is usually a light meal consisting of cereal, fruit, toast, juice, or coffee. Hosts will usually ask you to prepare your own breakfast.

LUNCH:

You will be responsible for buying your own lunch at school, from a local restaurant, or the local shops.

DINNER:

You will usually eat dinner with your host, or occasionally you may prepare your own meal with food supplied by your host.

TRANSPORT TO SCHOOL:

Your host will help you to find your way to and from school on your first day and will show you how to use public transport.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

MEDICAL INSURANCE

All students must have medical insurance for the duration of their stay in the UK. Students need to organize their own medical insurance before they travel. Kaplan does not offer travel and medical insurance in the UK, but students can either use the link on the Kaplan International Languages website to book travel and medical insurance directly with an insurance provider, or they can choose their own.

IF YOU GET SICK

If you get sick while in the UK you should visit a doctor. You can ask the Welfare Officer or your host family where the nearest doctor is. If you have a minor illness you can ask staff at a local chemist for advice. Remember to bring any relevant insurance or medical documentation with you. You may need to register with a local doctor.

PROTECTING YOUR BELONGINGS

We strongly recommend you take out insurance for your personal belongings, especially cameras, music players, mobile phones and laptops. Personal items cannot be covered by Kaplan homestay or residence insurance.

UNDER 18 STATEMENT

Kaplan recognizes its responsibility to safeguard and promote the welfare of students aged under 18, within the UK legal framework and criteria of our educational oversight and accrediting bodies. We endeavor to ensure a safe, positive and pleasant study and home environment for all students. We show an additional duty of care towards our students who are legally minors, monitoring them more closely than other students and requesting all parents of Under 18s to sign a Consent Form

- All Kaplan staff and host families adhere to our Safeguarding Policy, which includes training and regular guidance
- All staff and hosts in regular contact with under 18s are subject to rigorous recruitment procedures and necessary police checks
- Each KIE school has a named contact person for under 18s who meets the students on a regular basis, explains the legal status of under 18s, monitors any accommodation issues and liaises with the home stay and students' parents if necessary
- We ensure there are activities in the school which are suitable for students under 18 to participate in and inform Under 18s about learning and socializing outside of the classroom

LAWS

- No one under the age of 18 in the UK may buy or consume tobacco or alcohol, including beer and wine. It is against the law to buy tobacco or alcohol for someone you know is under the age of 18
- Driving under the influence of alcohol is a very serious crime and police make regular random checks
- You will need international ID to enter bars, clubs or pubs (e.g. passport, ID card, driving licence)
- Buying, selling and using drugs is illegal

EMERGENCY SERVICES

Call 999 in case of fire, medical emergency or if you need the police.

MEDICAL COSTS

Medical costs are at the discretion of your local doctor or hospital.

Minimum medical costs are as follows

- Consultation with a doctor: from £40
- Prescriptions at a chemist: £9.35 per item
- Dental treatment: from £50
- Eye test or new glasses: from £50



LOCAL CUSTOMS

- Women in the UK are equal to men and should always be treated fairly
- Always stand in line and wait your turn when buying tickets, at a bank or post office, or waiting for a bus. Keep to the left when standing on escalators
- "Please" and "thank you" are very important words! Always use them if you ask someone to do something for you, or if they help you or give you information



KAPLAN INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGES RULES

- If you leave your Kaplan International Languages course, the government may revoke your student visa and advise you to return home.
- You must attend all classes. If you do not attend your classes your representative will be informed. If a student is under 18, parents will be informed. If you do not then improve your attendance you will be sent home.
- Be on time for all your lessons.
- Always tell Kaplan International Languages if you are going to be absent from school for any reason and tell your host family if you are going away overnight.
- If you commit a criminal offence or have to be severely disciplined you will be sent home and no refund will be given. We will also inform the immigration authorities.
